



FGNWC Board of Directors Meeting

July 10, 2024

Board Members in Attendance: – John Lannamann – Chair, Jan Priest – Vice Chair, Phyllis Molnar – Secretary, Cyd Riede – Membership, Evelyne Kornreich – Projects, Dave Stout– Law Enforcement, Susan Tebbe - Director-at-Large.

Guests: - Capt Mark Rosser - FGPD; Leon Hairie – FGFD; John Wedgworth – FGRS.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00AM by John Lannamann (Chair).

1. **Welcome and Introductions** – John welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the July 10, 2024 Board Meeting.
2. **Fairfield Glade Police Department Update (FGPD)** – Capt Rosser stated the bullet-proof glass door has been installed and they are in the process of fine-tuning the speaker system. One of the new FGPD trainees will be attending the police academy in Knoxville and will return as a state-certified officer. Capt Rosser briefly discussed the stats for the month of June, but advised it is a preliminary report at this time. He explained on the Resident Assist line item, it entails many items as the Glade is a “service-oriented” Police Department. If a resident needs help while speaking with an officer, the officer will help if it is not illegal, immoral and the officer has the time and ability to help. John Wedgworth reminded Capt Rosser to have the officers refer residents to FGRS to utilize the Way To Go and Home Services programs that are available. He also reminded everyone to keep an eye open for elder neighbors. There are more incidents than people realize of residents dying in their homes and not being discovered for a period (up to six months). Look for signs: haven’t seen the person for a while, mail or packages piling up, grass un-mowed, does not answer door or phone – call and ask the police to do a welfare check.
3. **Fairfield Glade Fire Department Update (FGFD)** – Leon indicated the Fire Department had twelve calls for the month of June and 72 year-to-date. He said they do receive a lot of calls to change batteries in smoke alarms, which unfortunately, always seems to happen in the middle of the night. This year FGFD held a drill at Good Samaritans which involved the FGFD, FGPD, county and city. It was an unscheduled drill with only a few people knowing the event was happening. It was very helpful, and a decision was made to hold similar events in the future. The Pancake breakfast was a success serving 1324 people. The \$10,500 (gross) raised was on the low side as there were quite a few children’s meals. An additional \$7,000 was received in donations. A big thank you to ServPro who is sponsoring the three Pancake Breakfasts this year.
4. **Approval of Minutes** – Jan made a motion to approve the June 12, 2024 Board Meeting minutes; John seconded and the motion carried.

5. **Fairfield Glade Resident Services (FGRS)** – John Wedgworth hoped everyone saw the recent eBlast that went out on the Way To Go Program with almost 19,000 rides given since its inception with a total of 277,000 miles. Thanks to the article, FGRS had five residents step forward to be drivers. FGRS does have a new board member who will be starting this week and that new member happens to be a coordinator for FGNWC. The golf tournament will be held on September 15th and is nearly sold out, with this being their largest fundraiser for 2024. They do have a commitment from Bryce MacDonald of the Cumberland County Playhouse to do a fundraiser next year. Chief Kate Self made a presentation to FGRS on “at risk” residents and the key program, where officers have keys to certain houses. John commented that the Chief would also like to present that program to the FGNWC board.

6. **Treasurer’s Report** – Phyllis advised no checks were written during the past month; therefore, the bank balance remains the same.

7. **Membership** – Cyd stated we currently have 60 groups with one being a new group, the Beechwood Dr area.

8. **Old Business** –

- Map – Cyd and Phyllis reviewed the draft of the map and Cyd is working with SignWorks on a few changes. Cyd will try to get the finalized map by August 1st, so we have time to list the neighborhood watch groups on the map and have it available for upcoming FG information events,
- Promotional items – The LED keychain light, hand sanitizer and post-it-notes are the items we are considering having available at upcoming events. It was decided to start with one item at this time and possibly try different ones in the future. The post-it notes was selected by a show of hands. Evelyne and Cyd will meet with the promotional company to place the order using our logo on the notes.
- FGPD donation – Taser guns or security cameras were the two items being considered for the Police Department for a donation for Neighborhood Watch. Since the cost of taser guns has risen significantly, movable security cameras will be purchased. Evelyne motioned that we provide the funds (approximately \$500) for Capt. Rosser to purchase the three movable security cameras; Jan seconded, and the motion carried.
- Tip sheets – Evelyne worked with Capt Rosser to update the tip sheet “Driving in Fairfield Glade” and will have our webmaster add it to our website. The tip sheet on “Real ID” will also be added.

9. **New Business** –

- The FG Community Information Fair will be held on August 13th and the Get Involved Expo on October 17th. It was agreed FGNWC will have a table at the two events to promote our organization. Susan and Cyd will represent Neighborhood Watch at the Community information event on August 13th from 3:00 to 5:00PM and Cyd and John at the October 17th Get Involved event.
- Yearly elections – The offices of vice chair, law enforcement and membership are up for election. If the current individuals are interested in continuing to serve in their respective position, they will need to complete an application. The positions will be announced to the membership for anyone wishing to complete an application for one of the three positions. If more than one person is interested in a position, a vote will take place at the annual meeting. Cyd will be contacting all coordinators to invite

them to the annual coordinators' appreciation event. The FGNWC annual meeting, elections and coordinators appreciation event will begin at 9:00AM on October 9th at the FG Police Department.

The next Board meeting will be held on August 14, 2024, 8:00AM, at the FG Police Department. FGNWC Board Meetings are open to all residents.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50AM.

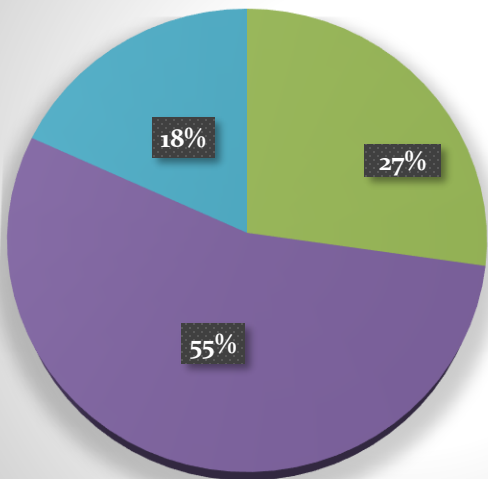

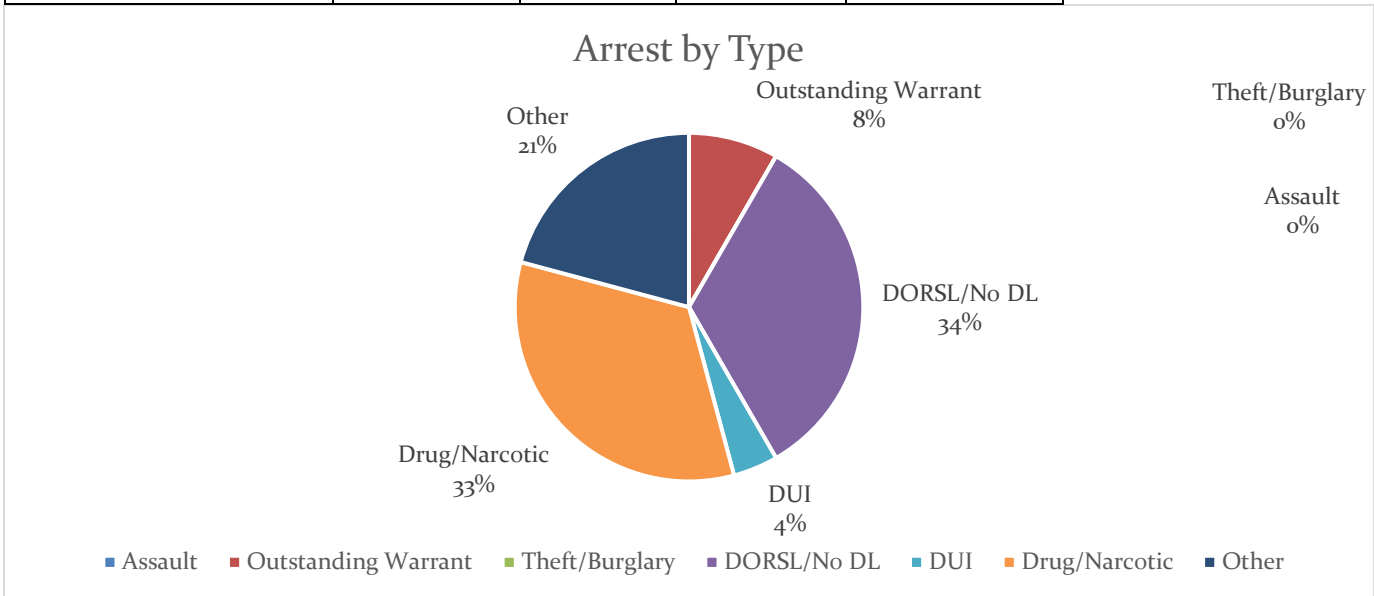

The arrest data represents physical arrests and citations issued in lieu of an arrest. The data also represents the total of offense charges issued.

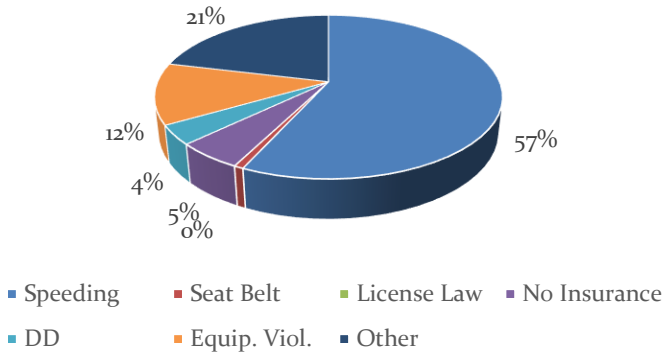

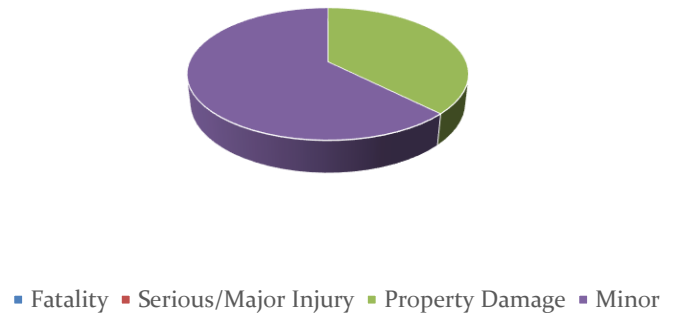

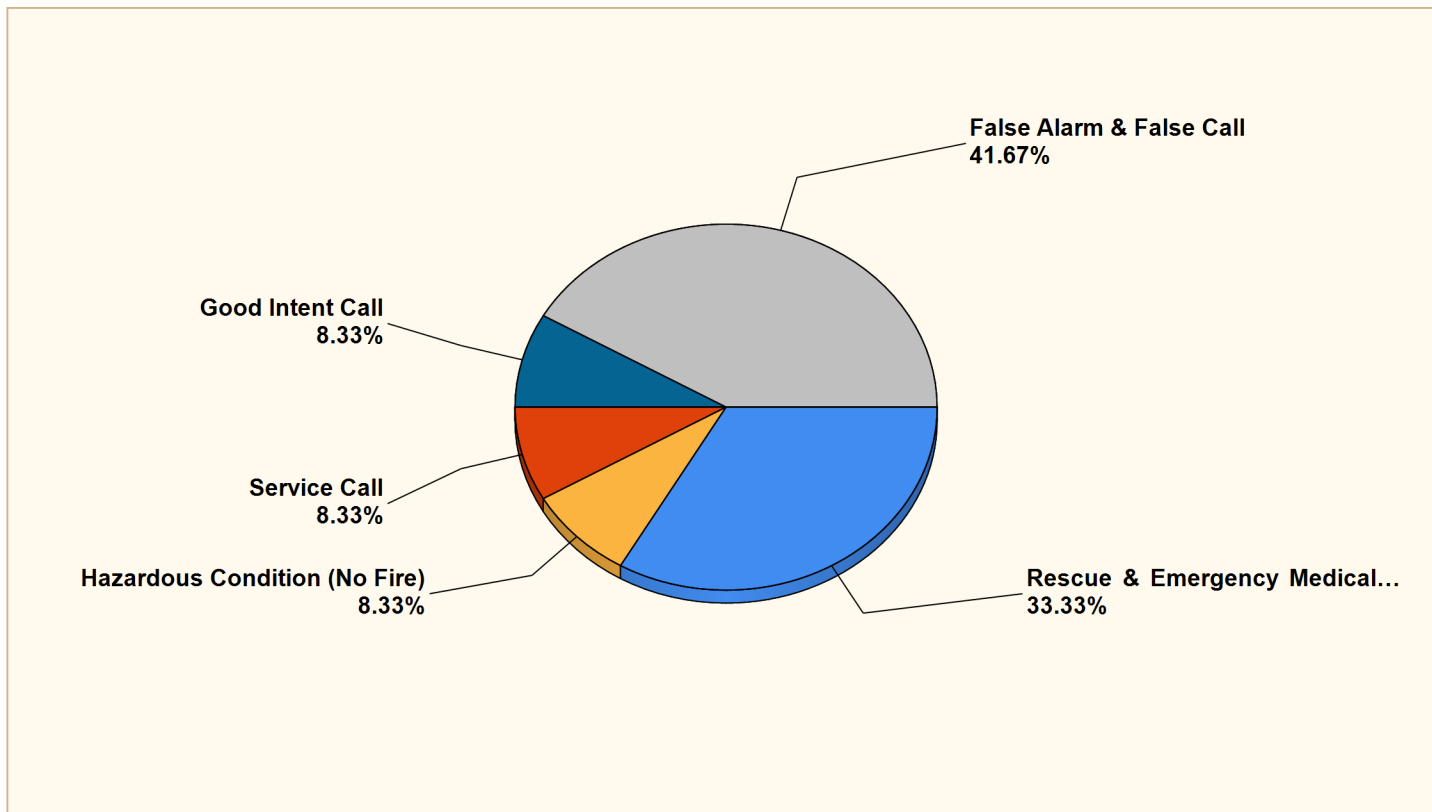
