

FGNWC Board of Directors Meeting

August 14, 2024

<u>Board Members in Attendance</u>: – John Lannamann – Chair, Jan Priest – Vice Chair, Phyllis Molnar – Secretary, Cyd Riede – Membership, Evelyne Kornreich – Projects, Dave Stout – Law Enforcement, Susan Tebbe - Directorat-Large.

<u>Guests</u>: - Capt Mark Rosser - FGPD; Leon Hairie – FGFD; John Wedgworth – FGRS; Phyllis Betz - coordinator The meeting was called to order at 8:00AM by John Lannamann (Chair).

- Welcome and Introductions John welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the August 14,
 Board Meeting.
- 2. <u>Fairfield Glade Police Department Update (FGPD)</u> Capt Rosser provided the June monthly report (attached) and briefly explained the listed items. He mentioned the three theft incidents were two scams and one theft of jewelry possibly by a cleaning person. Pet Nuisance calls were way up. The Mutual Aid calls are those outside of our jurisdiction which include calls to Food City and Weigels.

The FGPD and the FG Sportsman Club will again hold a Gun Safety and Information Seminar on August 23, 2024 at the Center from 1:00-3:00PM. FGNWC will help with setup and registration.

On August 29^{th,} the FGPD will have a Touch-A-Truck event at the Square from 10:00-1:00PM. This event is being held to show people what they can and cannot see with trucks, emergency vehicles and more.

The Citizens Academy will be held from October 8th- November 26th. This event is currently filled with a waiting list. FGNWC and FGRS have been asked to speak to the attendees.

Capt Rosser said the tactical support items purchased by FGNWC for the FGPD have been received and thanked Neighborhood Watch for the equipment. Thank you to the Glade Sun and the Vista for the articles on the donation.

3. <u>Fairfield Glade Fire Department Update (FGFD) –</u> Leon Hairie provided the July statistics advising there were a total of 15 calls for the month (report attached). There were six EMS calls of providing assistance, with a total of 28 year-to-date. One of the fires in July was a fully involved car fire. Leon mentioned items that are not listed on the monthly report. These items are that the FGFD has installed eleven house-number signs, has installed forty-four smoke detectors and received seventeen calls for issues with smoke detectors that they responded to.

- 4. <u>Approval of Minutes</u> Evelyne made a motion to approve the July 10, 2024 Board Meeting minutes; Jan seconded and the motion carried.
- 5. <u>Fairfield Glade Resident Services (FGRS)</u> John Wedgworth stated all is going well at FGRS with Way To Go continuing to grow. In October a program will be rolled out for residents for early voting and on election day. Everyone is encouraged to get out and vote.

Resident Services has linked their website with FGPD and FGNWC so you can easily check out each other's events to see what is happening. A reminder that August 31st is the FGFD Pancake Breakfast from 6-11:00AM at the Center. FGRS is currently speaking to Tennessee magazine for a possible profile of FGRS in their October issue with highlights on the Way To Go and Home Safety programs. FGRS currently has about 130 volunteers and will always welcome more. All volunteers are Fairfield Glade residents, and all programs are only for our residents, we do not go outside with our services.

- 6. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> Phyllis reported checks were written during the month for the FGPD tactical support items, promotional items for the FGNWC table at Information events, the FGNWC map and markers and brochures.
- 7. <u>Membership</u> Cyd provided the board members with an updated Coordinators list.

8. Old Business –

- FGNWC Map Cyd showcased the new FGNWC map. The groups have been identified on the map by color (organized, needing a coordinator, or in the process of organizing) and the location of FGNWC signs are shown in yellow. Cyd will attach a legend showing the coordinator for each group and will attach it to the back of the map.
- Promotional Items Susan provided one of the post-it pads purchased for promotional events. Evelyne was able to have them in time for the recent Information Day at the Center and will also take them to the Information event in October.
- Tip Sheets Evelyne is still waiting for two tip sheets to be completed by board members. The tip sheet on Real ID has been finalized and is now on the FGNWC website.
- Update on planned events Evelyne and Jan will be at the FGNWC table for the next informational event on October 17th. The FGPD Gun Safety event will be held on August 23rd from 1:00-3:00PM
- Nomination form for upcoming elections Evelyne provided the nomination form for the three positions open on the board (vice chair, membership director, and law enforcement director). Cyd will provide all coordinators with the forms.

9. **New Business** –

- Planning of Annual Meeting and Coordinator's Appreciation Breakfast Cyd will work on the agenda and contact the speakers. Evelyne will handle the refreshments. The Annual meeting will begin at 9:00AM on October 9th for all coordinators.
- Shredder Truck Discussion took place, and it was mentioned that there have been several shredder trucks already this year. Consensus was to table the shredder truck until next year.

The next Board meeting will be held on September 11, 2024, 8:00AM, at the FG Police Department. FGNWC Board Meetings are open to all residents.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:58AM.




