



FGNWC Board of Directors Meeting

April 11, 2025

Board Members in Attendance: Jan Priest – Vice Chair, Phyllis Molnar – Secretary, Cyd Riede – Membership, Evelyne Kornreich – Projects; Susan Tebbe - Director-at-Large.

Guests: - Tracie Burgess - FGPD; Leon Hairie – FGFD; John Wedgworth – FGRS; Phyllis Betz.

Absent: – John Lannamann – Chair; Darby Lannom– Law Enforcement.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00AM by Jan Priest (acting Chair).

1. **Welcome and Introductions** – Jan welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the April 11, 2025, Board Meeting.
2. **Fairfield Glade Police Department Update (FGPD)** – Tracie Burgess commented that a motorcycle event is scheduled for April 18th at the Square, however due to the forecast for rain the event may need to be cancelled for the fourth year in a row. On Friday, May 16th from 1:00-3:00 at the Center, a Scam class will be held which is greatly needed as residents come in daily with new reports of scams. Also, on May 16th from 11:00-1:00 (or until filled) a shredder truck will be in the Center parking lot.

CarFit will be held on June 10th in the FGPD parking lot. On July 22nd, FGCC, with assistance from the FGPD, will hold a Touch-a-Truck event. Currently scheduled for 11:00 -1:00 at the Square it will include all varieties of trucks from maintenance to golf and more.

The FGPD had a busy March which included a justifiable homicide. Just in the month of March, 294 speeding tickets were written and 60 citations for seatbelt violations, which is a huge increase. To date, the biggest offense for arrest is having no valid driver's license; 19 people received a hard citation where they will need to appear in court. Driver's licenses can be revoked for having no insurance for a for certain amount of time.

Light law violations were high with 54 citations/warnings (headlights, brake lights, license plates).

Due Care/Distracted Driving violations were high with 26 instances; people need to remember Tennessee is a hands-free state.

Surprisingly, there were no DUIs in the month of March.

One Domestic arrest (female) occurred. No one was badly hurt but it was an altercation of a boyfriend and girlfriend.

John Wedgworth thanked the Police Department for helping with wellness checks. Tracie explained that phone calls are received asking if someone would check on their grandmother, friend, whomever and the caller is relieved that our police officers will perform that service. As Tracie explained, they would rather check on someone and find all is okay rather than finding an individual has died. Their key/code program has saved lives in the past when a resident has fallen or cannot get to the door; if a key or door code is on file at the FGPD, the officers can enter the home without breaking down the door.

3. **Fairfield Glade Fire Department Update (FGFD)** – Leon advised the FD had 32 calls which was a record for one month. For March, the department responded to the brush fire, the Village Green Mall and at Stone Castle Place. As a reminder, the FGFD Pancake Breakfast will be held on May 24th.

4. **Approval of Minutes** – Evelynne made a motion to approve the March 12, 2025, Board Meeting minutes; Cyd seconded and the motion carried.

5. **Fairfield Glade Resident Services (FGRS)** – Things are going well at FGRS. With generous donations, FGRS was able to purchase a utility trailer for the Home Safety Program, which has grown considerably. With the donated funds, tools have been purchased as the volunteers have been using their personal tools and vehicles.

On April 22nd, Randy Davis, President/CAE of Cumberland Medical Center will do a town hall meeting at 2:00 in the Center to update residents on CMC and CMC/Fairfield.

6. **FGNWC Board of Directors** – Jan informed the board that John Lannamann has submitted his resignation as FGNWC Chair due to medical reasons. Phyllis made a motion to accept the resignation, Evelynne seconded and the motion carried. Jan will move into the position of acting Chair for the remainder of the term.

7. **Treasurer's Report** – Phyllis advised there have been no changes to the checking account.

8. **Membership** – Through the Volunteer Expo Susan and Cyd found two new coordinators who agreed to revive two established groups that had no coordinator.

9. **Old Business** –

- Tip Sheets – Evelynne asked that anyone who has an updated Tip Sheet to send them to Phyllis for inclusion into the master files.

10. **New Business** –

- Agenda for planned events – If anyone would like to help the FGPD with CarFit on June 10th from 11-1:00pm call Tracie at FGPD.
- Update on website and advertising -Evelynne worked with our webmaster during the winter to try to make our website more informative and appealing. Further discussion and ideas are needed.

The next Board meeting will be held on May 14, 2025, at 8:00AM, at the FG Police Department. FGNWC Board Meetings are open to all residents.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:05AM.

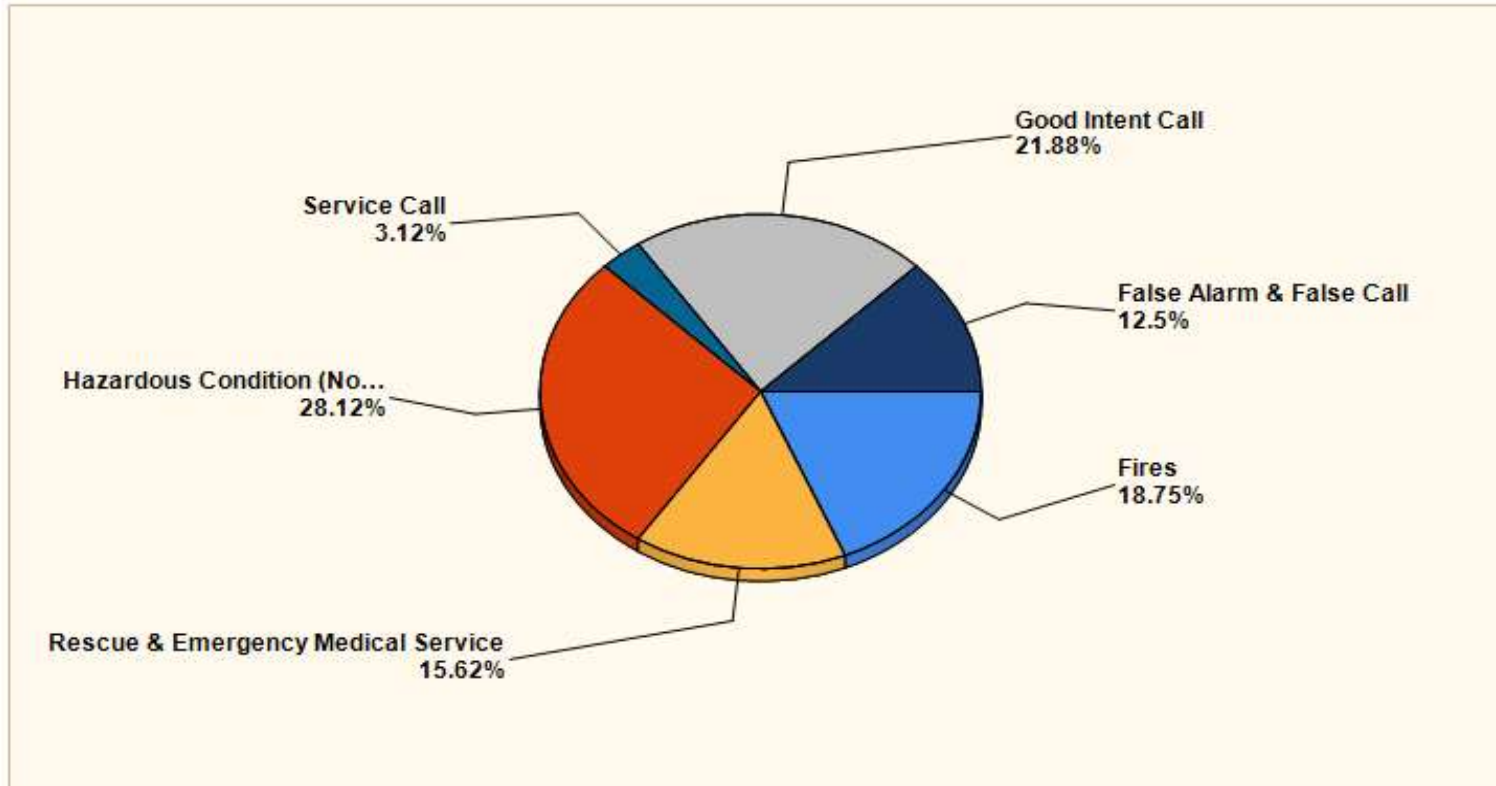
