The meeting was called to order at 8:00AM by Jan Priest (Chair).

1. **Welcome and Introductions** – Jan welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the May 14, 2025, Board Meeting.
2. **Fairfield Glade Police Department Update (FGPD)** – Capt. Rosser mentioned the upcoming Scam Seminar and shredder truck event being held on May 16th and stated it is always one of their biggest events of the year.

No major occurrences have occurred so far this month. The Police Department is receiving several complaints about door-to-door salespeople, where residents think door-to-door solicitation is not allowed. Capt. Rosser said that solicitation is legal in the Glade just like anywhere else in the county.

Attached are the monthly statistics for the FGPD. Capt. Rosser stated no burglaries occurred in April and that Fairfield Glade is the safest community in the county. We do have thefts from time to time, but they are very rare. Most burglaries at businesses happen at night, where homes are burglarized during the day. In Fairfield Glade it is harder for a thief to tell if someone is home or not and is also aware a neighbor is probably home. Homes in the county may be more spread out and people are at work. Most homes in Fairfield have garages so a thief cannot tell if you are home or not. Speeding citations are down from last year; however, we are getting into our busy season.

3. **Fairfield Glade Fire Department Update (FGFD)** – No report, as no representative was available to attend the meeting.
4. **Approval of Minutes** – Cyd made a motion to approve the April 11, 2025, Board Meeting minutes; Darby seconded, and the motion carried.
5. **Fairfield Glade Resident Services (FGRS)** – John Wedgworth commented there was a good attendance for the recent Dispatch to Response Seminar at the Center. On May 15th FGRS is having a dedication and blessing of their new utility truck and the volunteers of the Home Safety program. Everything is going well at FGRS.

6. **Treasurer's Report** – In Phyllis' absence, Jan advised there were no changes to the checking account.
7. **Membership** – Cyd advised there are no updates to membership.
8. **Old Business** – Tip Sheets – Jan advised that Evelyne was unable to reach anyone regarding the FG Phone Directory. John Wedgworth said they have not received new directories for this year and agreed it is impossible to reach anyone at that office. Jan made a motion to delete the Tip sheet on the directory, Susan seconded, and the motion carried. All other Tip sheets are up to date.

The next Board meeting will be held on June 11, 2025, 8:00AM, at the FG Police Department. FGNWC Board Meetings are open to all residents.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20AM.

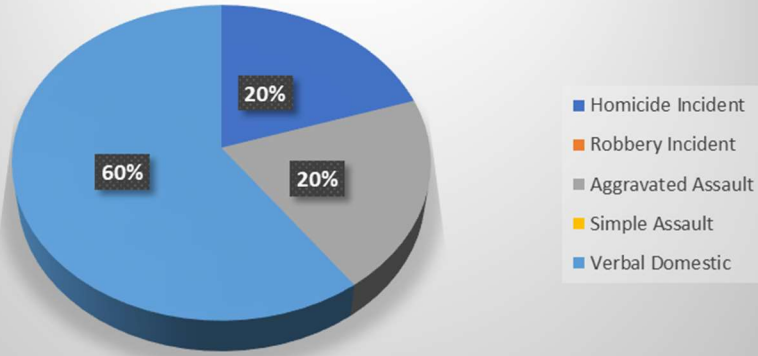

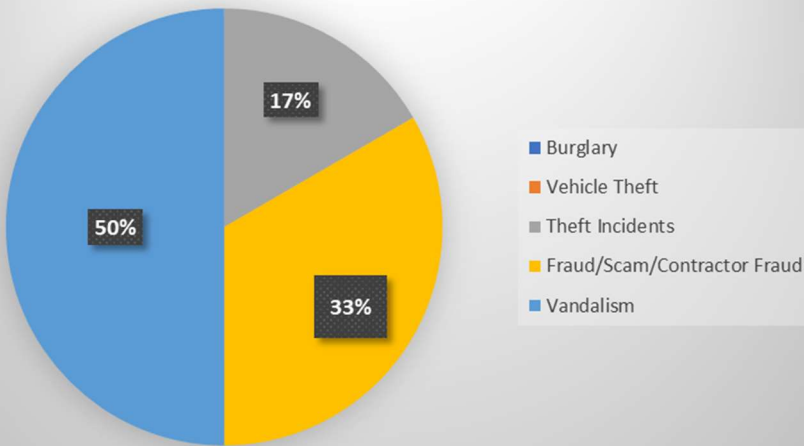

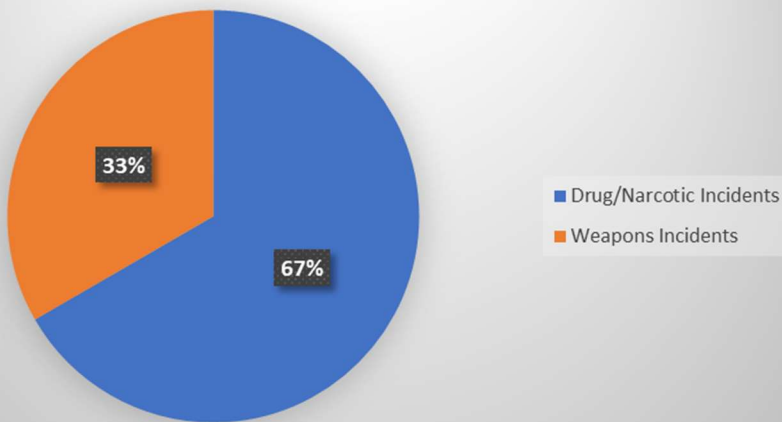
Person Crimes Month



Property Crimes Month

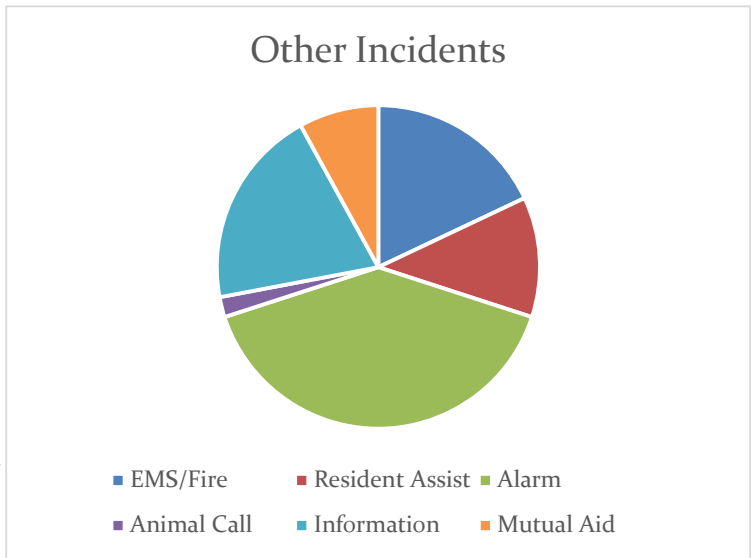
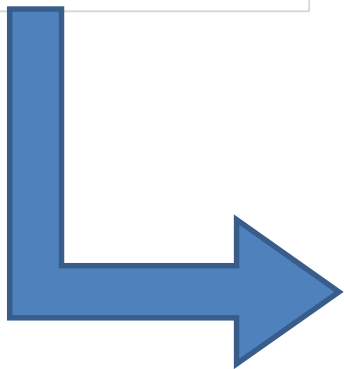
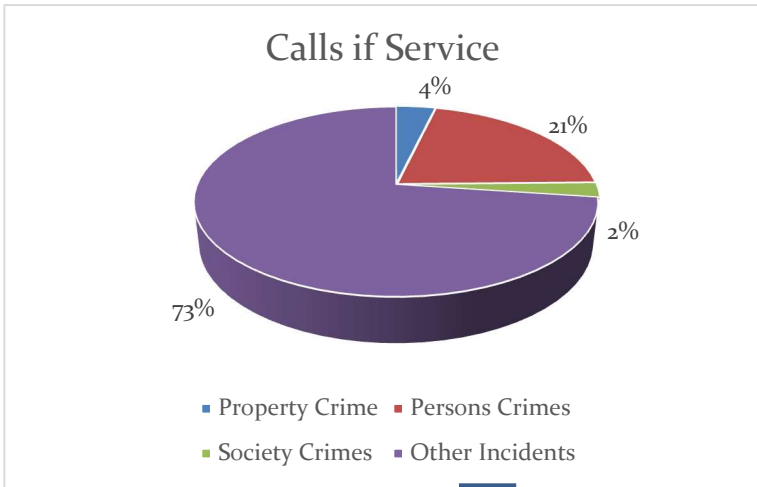

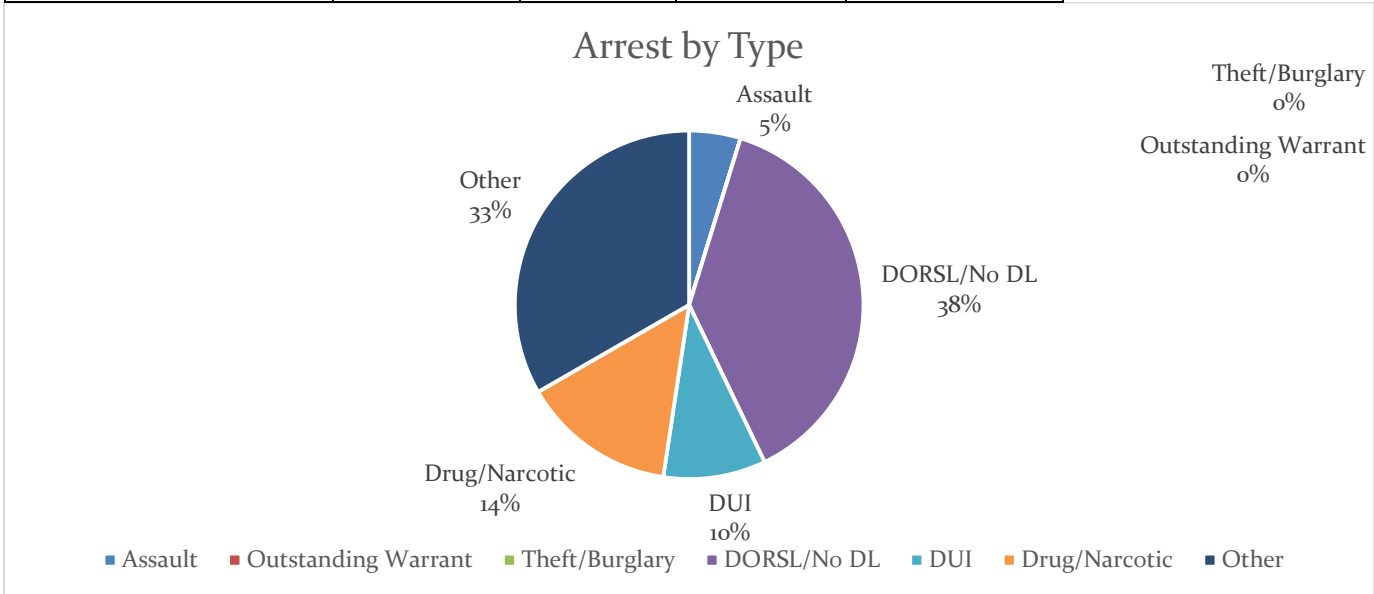

The arrest data represents physical arrests and citations issued in lieu of an arrest. The data also represents the total of offense charges issued.

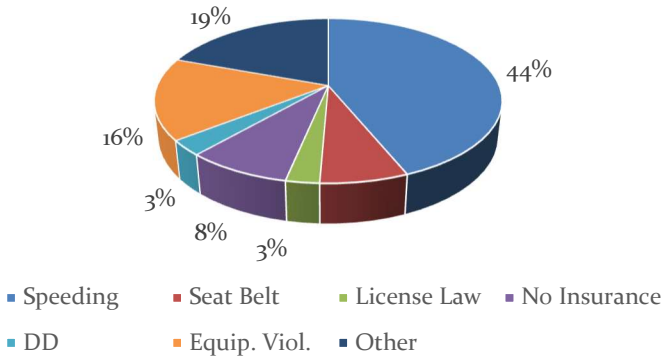

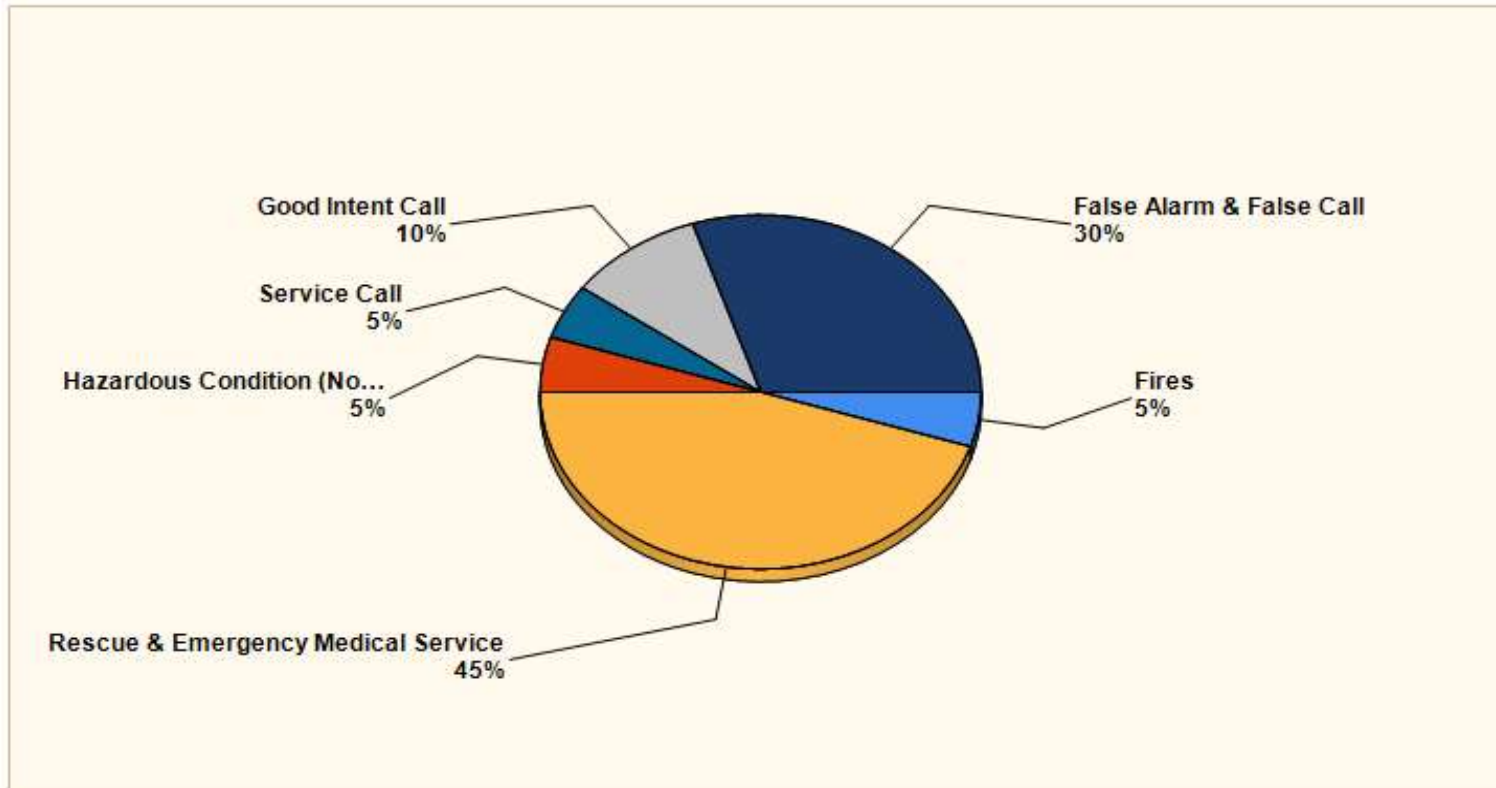
