



FGNWC Board of Directors Meeting

June 11, 2025

Board Members in Attendance: – Jan Priest – Chair; Cyd Riede – Membership (via FaceTime), Evelyne Kornreich – Projects, Darby Lannom– Law Enforcement, Susan Tebbe - Director-at-Large (via speaker phone).

Guests: - Chief Kate Self and Sgt. Jamie Wyatt - FGPD; Josephine Cassidy – FGFD; Phyllis Betz.

Absent: Phyllis Molnar – Secretary, John Wedgworth – FGRS Liaison.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00AM by Jan Priest (Chair).

1. **Welcome and Introductions** – Jan welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the June 11, 2025, Board Meeting.
2. **Fairfield Glade Police Department Update (FGPD)** – Chief Self introduced Sgt. Jamie Wyatt who will be the new Police liaison for FGNWC. She indicated that going forward, Darby would be reporting on the monthly statistics and she or Sgt. Wyatt would be available to answer questions Darby could not.

A discussion took place regarding the murder reported in the stats. To summarize, the event was first reported as a domestic issue regarding a man with a gun in Crossville. Somehow the man ended up in Fairfield and was then involved in a traffic stop. The driver shot at the FG Police officer who returned fire and eventually the shooter was shot and died. The FBI investigated and determined whether the officer was correct in his actions and has since been cleared. A comment was made that the community should have been kept more informed. But the Chief said that once a situation becomes an TBI matter, the TBI takes care of all announcements.

Darby said the FGPD is hoping to reschedule a CarFit sometime this year. Regarding an additional shredder truck event for the fall, Darby indicated that the spring shredder truck event cost \$400 for two hours. Previously the Police Chief and FGNWC said they would be interested in holding a joint shredding event in the fall. Evelyne also indicated that FGRS had expressed interest in the past in sharing the cost. She will follow through and see if that is still the case. Darby provided the board members with flyers of upcoming events being hosted by the police (events listed at end of minutes). FGNWC will discuss the possibility of setting up an information table at one of the upcoming events.

3. **Fairfield Glade Fire Department Update (FGFD)** – Josephine said for the month of May, the FGFD had 16 calls: 1 fire, 6 EMS, 5 Hazardous Conditions, 2 Good Intent, and 2 False Alarms. The May fire was a shed that was destroyed as well as its contents, but there was no further damage to the property. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Year to date the fire department has responded to 10 fires, 28 EMS, 18 Hazardous conditions, 4 General Service, 14 Good Intent and 19 False Alarms.

The Pancake Breakfast will be on July 5th, 6-11am. They had a great turnout for the Memorial Weekend breakfast and hope for a good response again. The Labor Day breakfast will be on August 30th.

4. **Approval of Minutes** – Jan made a motion to approve the May 14, 2025, Board Meeting minutes; all agreed, and the motion carried.

5. **Treasurer's Report** – Jan reported (in Phyllis' absence) that one check was written for \$38.69 for postage for the survey.

6. **Fairfield Glade Resident Services (FGRS)** – John Wedgworth was unable to attend the meeting, but Jan asked that if anyone has received a survey from FGRS, would they please complete and submit it. It is a survey for input for CMC Community Health Needs Assessment since John Wedgworth serves on the Cumberland Medical Center Steering Committee which is developing the 2025 Cumberland County Community Health Needs Assessment. It is believed the comments will be important in determining which programs should be addressed in the near future.

7. **Membership** – Cyd commented that she received a resignation letter from a coordinator. But because of her and Susan's attendance at one of the info events, they had gotten the name of a resident who was interested in becoming a coordinator, so the spot was filled.

8. **Old Business** – Evelyne apologized she was not able to get to the tip sheets. But she did state that she is having the FG Directory Tip sheet removed as the directory no longer exists. She will work with our webmaster as to which Tip sheets need to be replaced, added or dropped.

9. **New Business** –

- Under new business, Evelyne presented the prices from one company for decals and by the next meeting more quotes will be available as well as costs to the community and distribution of them.
- Evelyne spoke about the Surveys and their results. 36 coordinators and/or directors responded, 19 did not respond (even after receiving reminders), 2 surveys were returned with an invalid address (Cyd will follow through to see if the coordinators' information needs correcting). Evelyne compiled the comments provided by the coordinators and feels they will be beneficial in determining some of the questions going forward.

The next Board meeting will be held on July 9, 2025, 8:00AM, at the FG Police Department. FGNWC Board Meetings are open to all residents.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15AM.

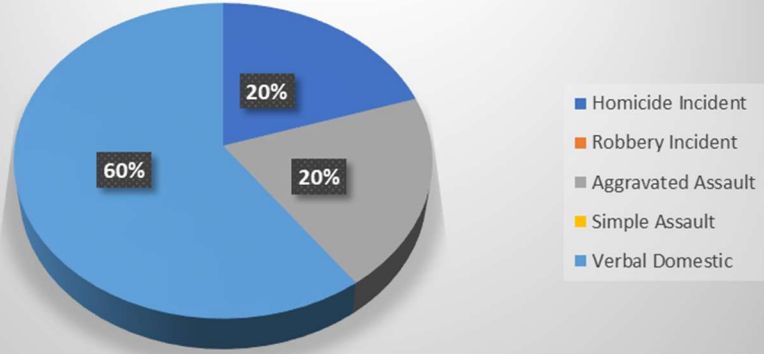

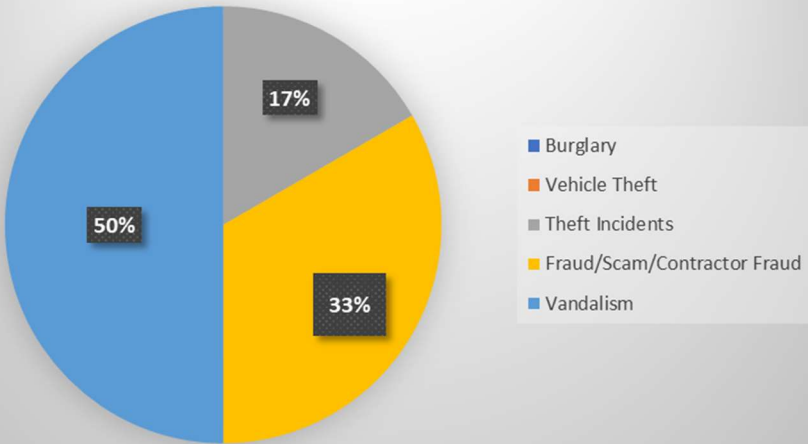

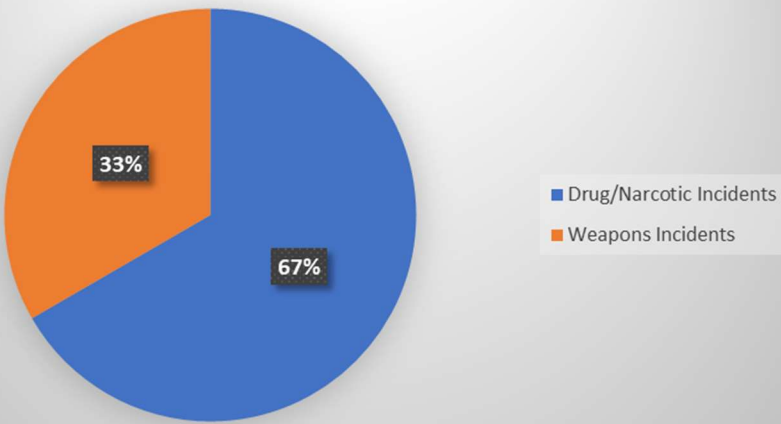
Person Crimes Month



Property Crimes Month

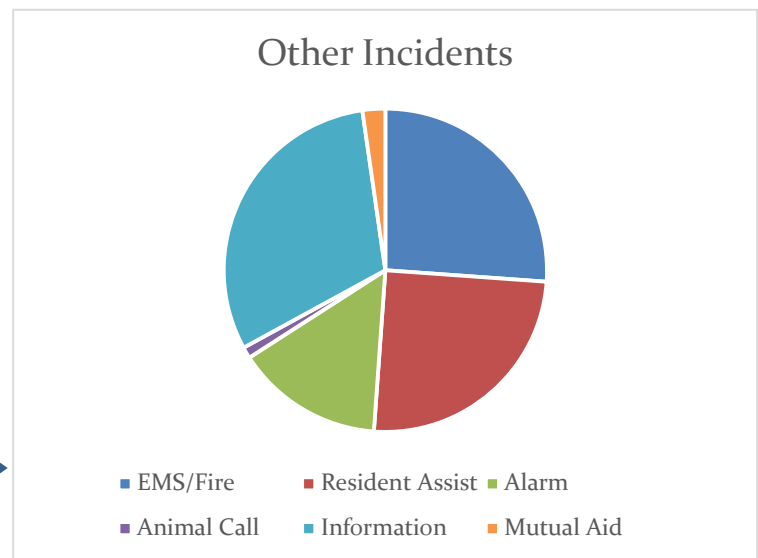
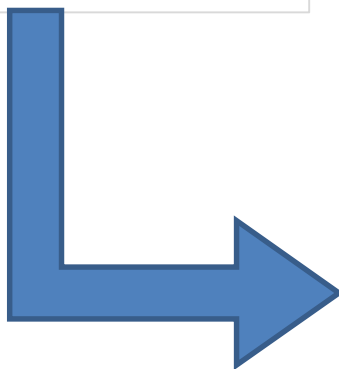
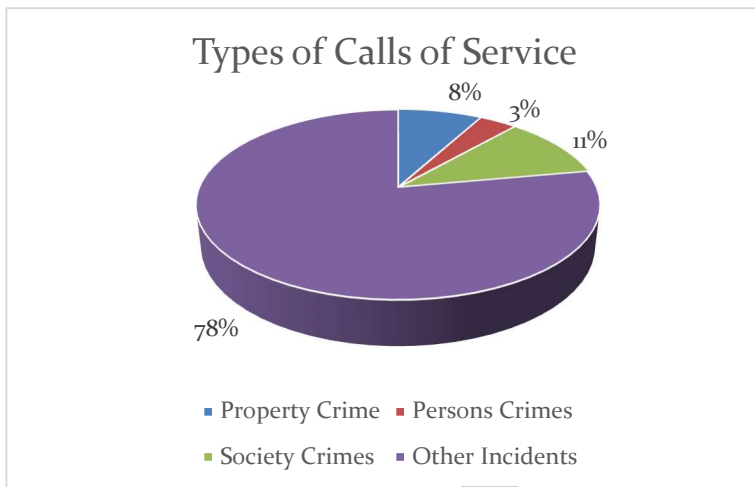

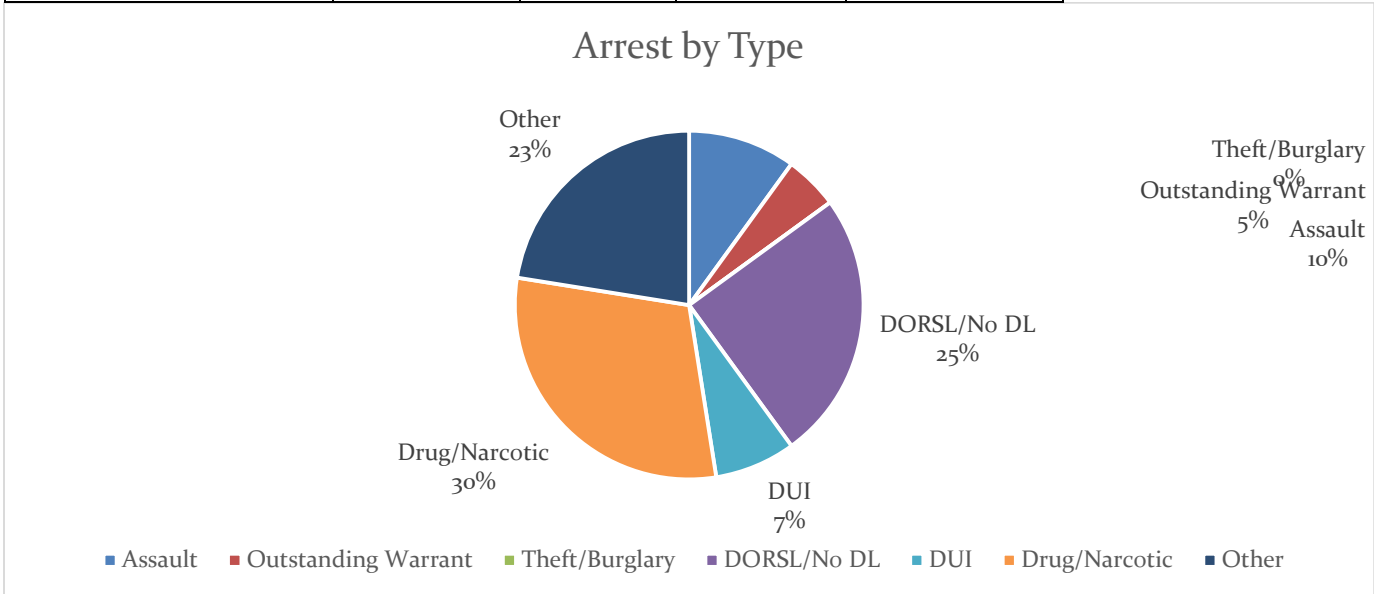

The arrest data represents physical arrests and citations issued in lieu of an arrest. The data also represents the total of offense charges issued.

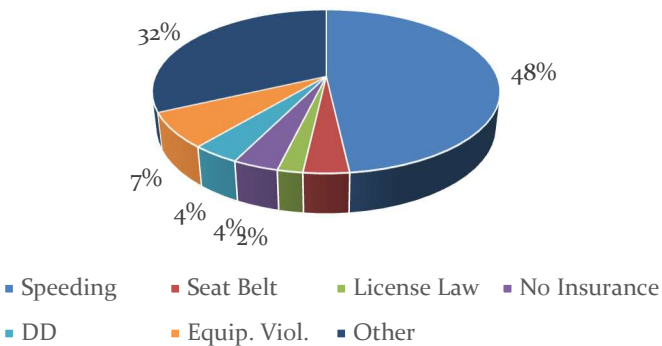

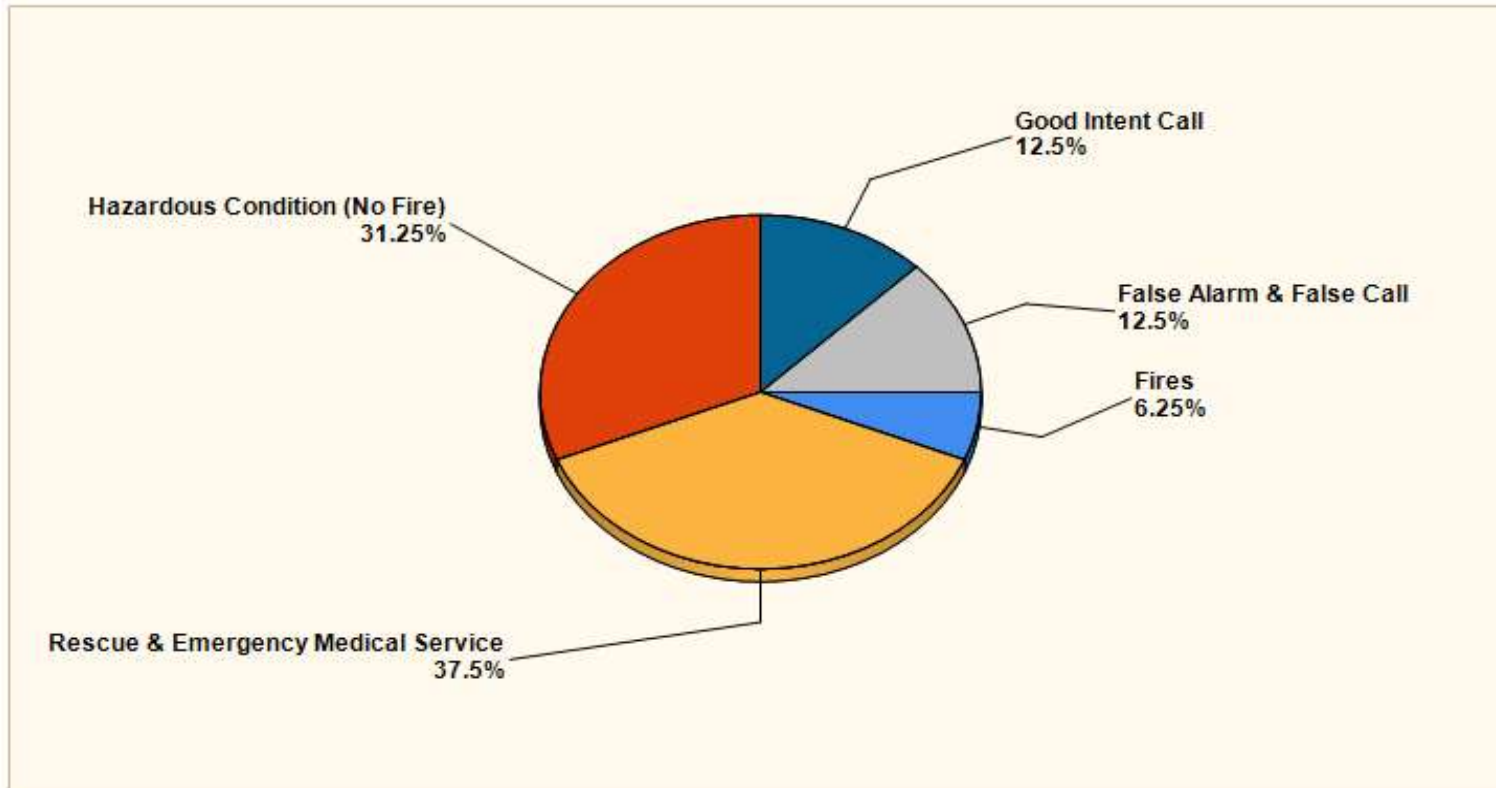
